SCHOOL PROFILE

MISSION STATEMENT

THE CLINTON SCHOOL offers a seven-year liberal arts program that engages students in authentic learning. As a public school, we promote educational equity by providing the International Baccalaureate Diploma Program to all students. Clinton is a close-knit, collaborative community of families and educators that models reflective learning and supports students in the challenges they encounter in school and throughout their lives.

SCHOOL OVERVIEW AND HISTORY

Clinton's educational philosophy of building flexible thinking through inquiry-based learning has enriched the lives of New York City adolescents for more than 40 years. Clinton is well known for its welcoming environment and the passion that students, families, and staff share for our school. In 2015, we began our expansion to a 6–12 school and have put down roots in a new building, off Union Square in Manhattan. Our first class graduated in June 2019.

In 2016, Clinton received authorization as an **IB World School** and now offers the International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma Program. Our Upper Grades program (9th through 12th grades) is built as an **"International Baccalaureate for ALL"** model with students completing NYS Regents Examinations requirements by the end of 10th grade in order to participate in all IB courses in 11th and 12th grades. In 2023 we became a candidate school for the IB Middle Years Program and expect authorization in the spring with a start date of September, 2024. With a student population of **839**, Clinton maintains a close-knit and collaborative learning environment.

ACADEMIC PROGRAM

By the end of 10th grade, students are expected to meet and exceed NY State Regents high school standards in Algebra 1, English, Geometry, Living Environment (Biology), and Global History. Students also complete coursework that prepares them for

the IB in the Arts and Spanish Language. In the 11th and 12th grades, Clinton students enroll in the International Baccalaureate Diploma Program. Students take a selection of six courses at the Higher Level (HL) or Standard Level (SL): Biology, Film, Global Politics, History, Language and Literature, Math, Spanish and Visual Arts. All IB Diploma candidates are expected to also complete an Extended Essay, the Theory of Knowledge course, and engage in Creativity, Action, and Service Activities.

ADMISSIONS

Our high school is a screened school that selects students based on academic merit with criteria that is published each year.

NEW YORK STATE GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS CREDITS AND EXAMS

Our graduation requirements meet or exceed New York State requirements. Students must score a 65 or higher on five Regents Examinations. (ELA, Math, History, Science and a "plus one" in any of these subject areas.)

DIPLOMA OPTIONS

All students graduate with a New York State Regents Diploma. In lieu of offering an Advanced Regents Diploma, The Clinton School offers students the option of pursuing an International Baccalaureate Diploma. In 2023 71% of eligible candidates were awarded an IB Diploma.

GRADE CONVERSION

All grades are reported on a 100-point scale with 65 being a passing grade. All courses are included in a student's GPA except for Physical Education, Science Labs, courses that have no credit value, and courses taken on a pass / fail basis.

WEIGHTING

Weighted grades are included in the student's cumulative semester GPA and overall GPA.

COVID-19 EXCEPTION

As per NYCDOE academic policy, all students had the option of taking one or more classes for credit only from the spring semester of 2020 through the spring semester of 2023.

STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT

The Clinton School does not assign a rank in class to students. Student achievement is recognized by the awards of Honors and High Honors at mid-year intervals. Students are eligible to apply for National Honor Society (NHS) after the first semester of their sophomore year. Admission into NHS is based on a student's demonstration of scholarship, leadership, service and character.
